

Q&A for June 10-17, 2010

- 1) The RFP has two sections that addresses funding and budget - Section V (A) and Section VI (A)(c)(4). I'm wondering what's the difference between "payment structure" and "price proposal." Is the payment structure supposed to be included in our price proposal? Should our budget include a set "price" for the cases we'll be bringing in to the firm - e.g. a lump sum for those cases?
 - a. Section VI sets forth all of the information which must be contained in a proposal. The payment structure is part of the price proposal. In Section VI(A)(3)(c)(3) it states that a proposer who has current cases should provide an approximate number of cases which would be transferred as well as a proposed payment schedule for the ongoing cases. More information is provided under Section V as to how a payment schedule might be determined. The OCR intended for the items mentioned in Section V(A) also to be included in Section VI either under section VI(A)(3) or VI(A)(4). The budget narrative in VI(A)(4)(f) can be used to add additional information if the proposer believes an item from Section V isn't adequately covered under the requirements in Section VI.
